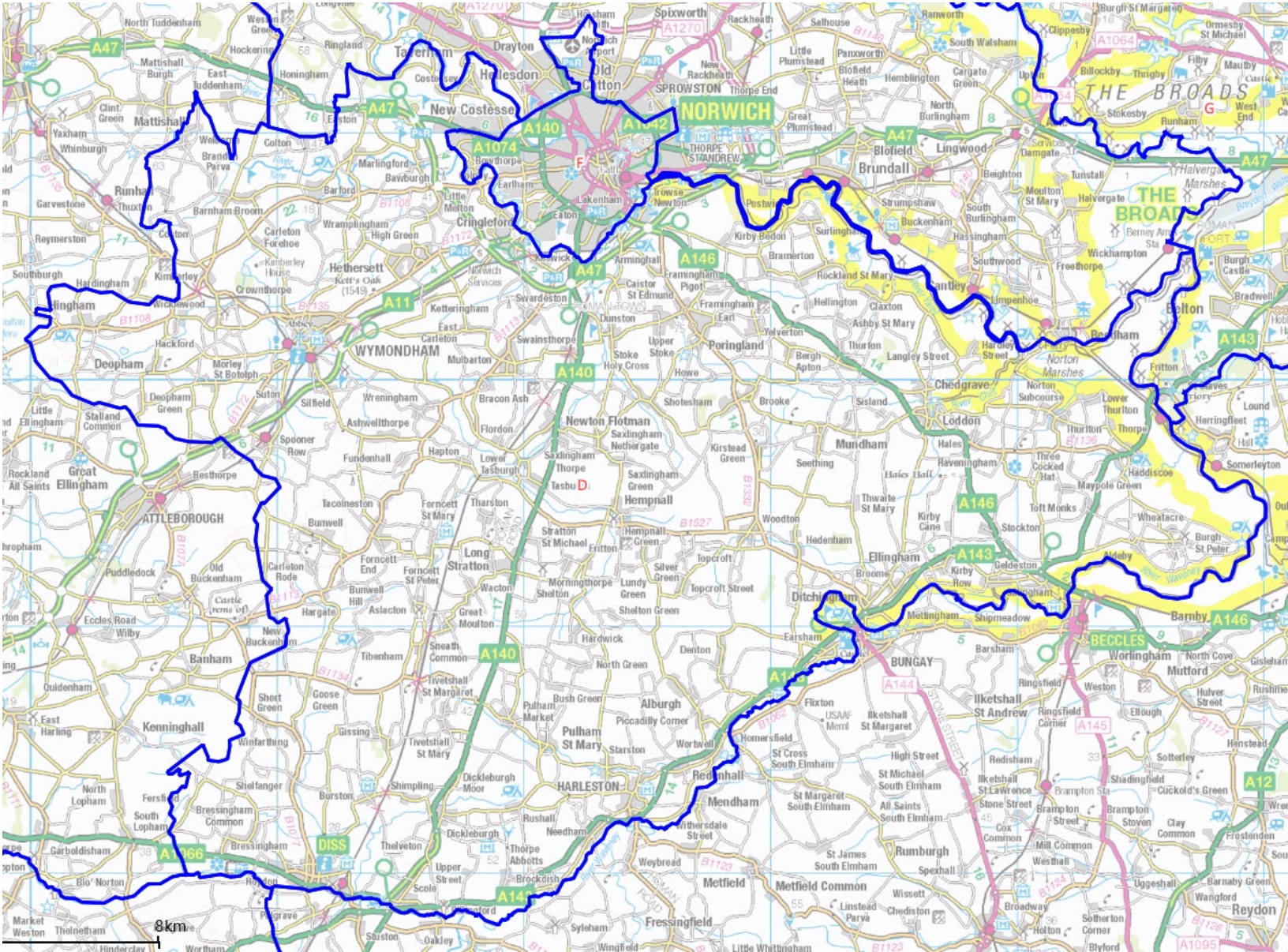

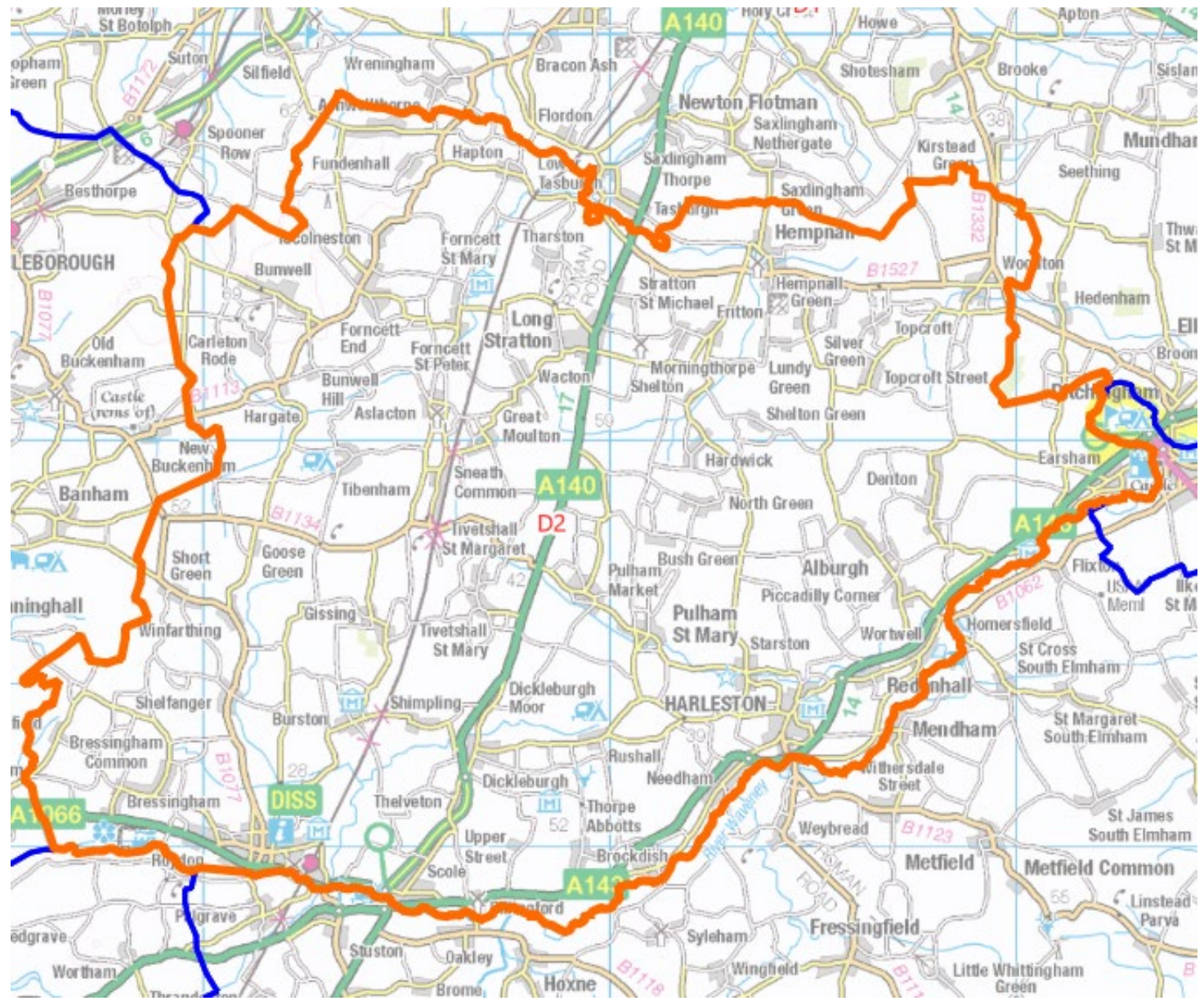

Core Functions:

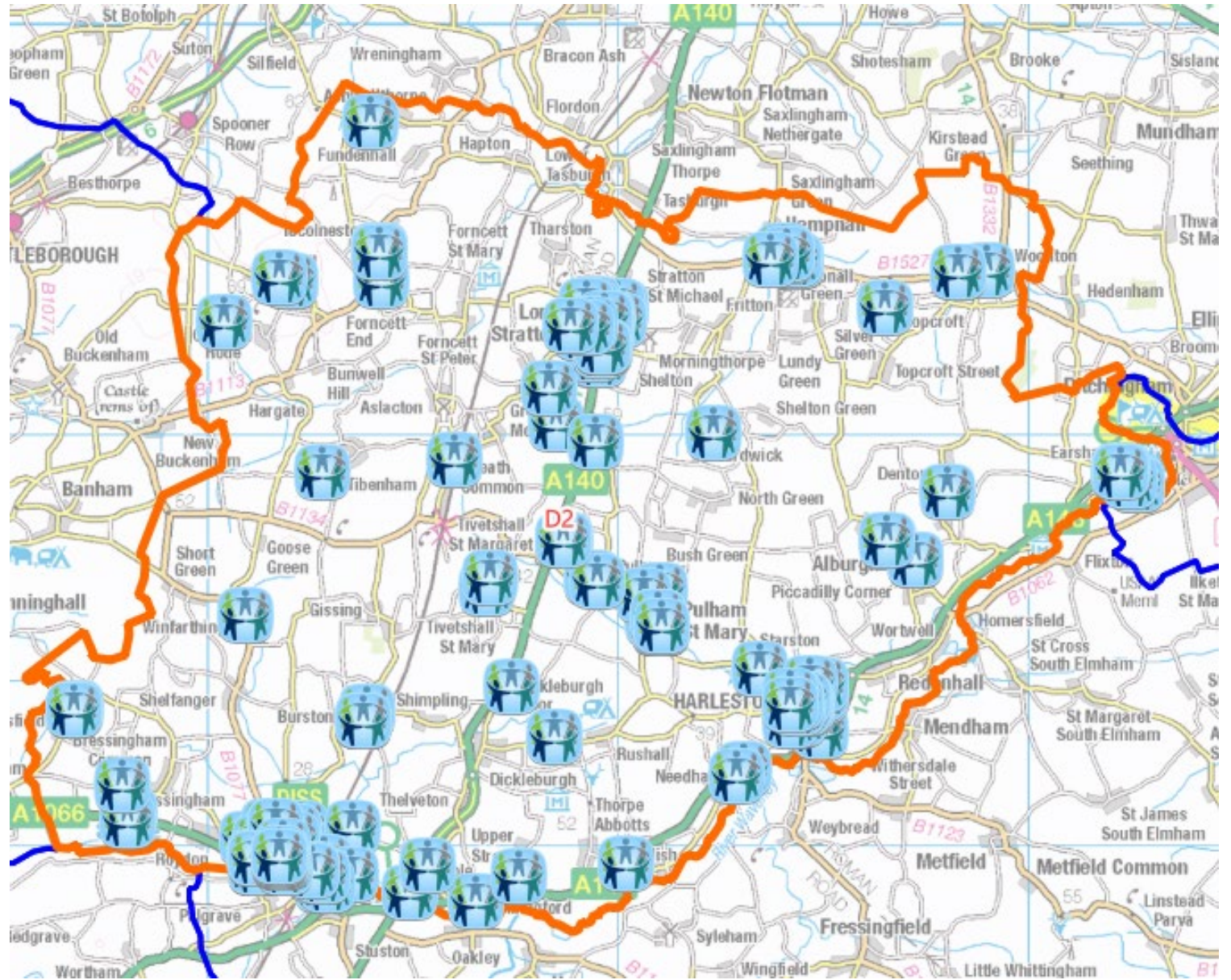
Engagement, visibility and targeted activity.

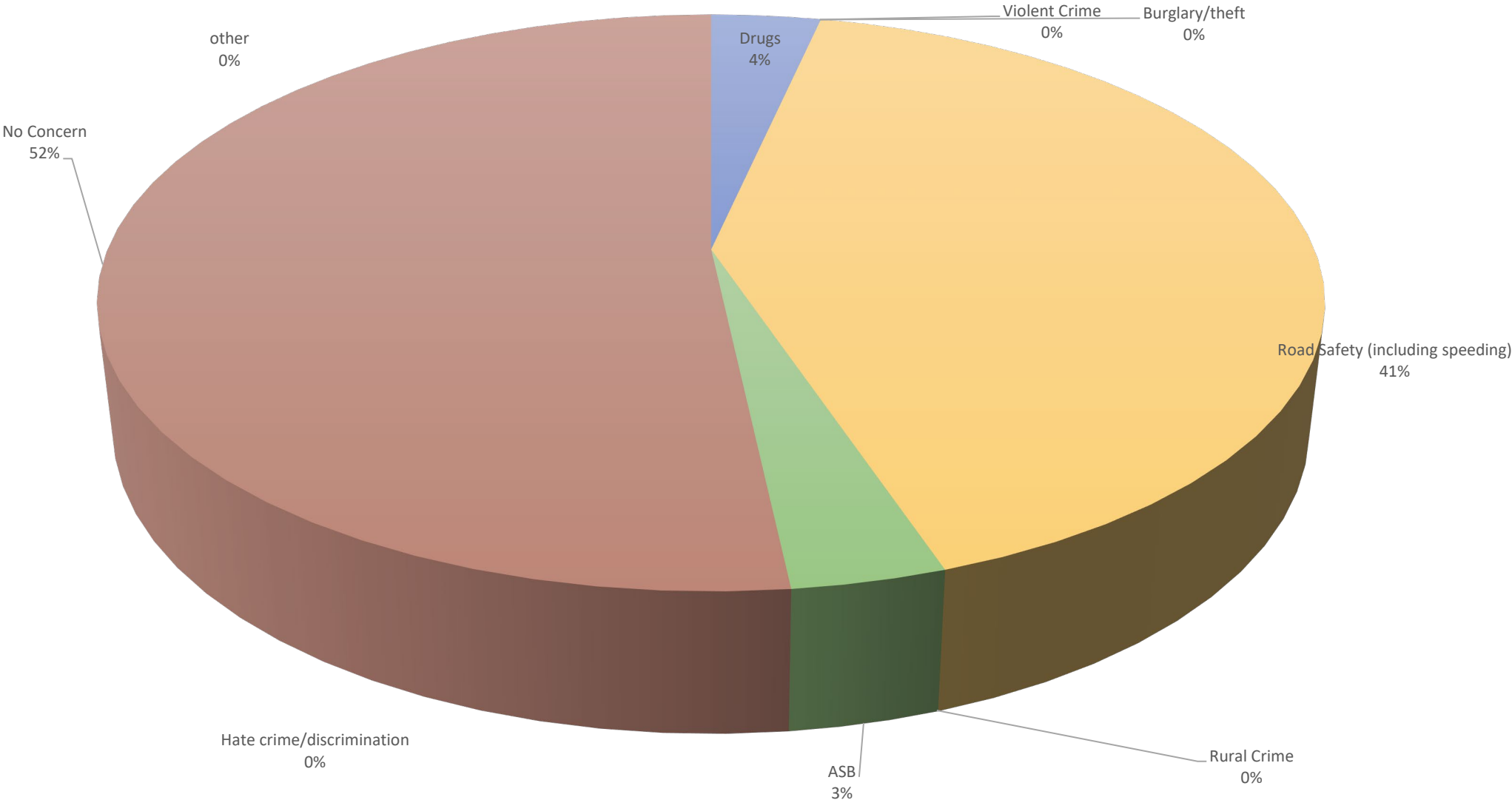

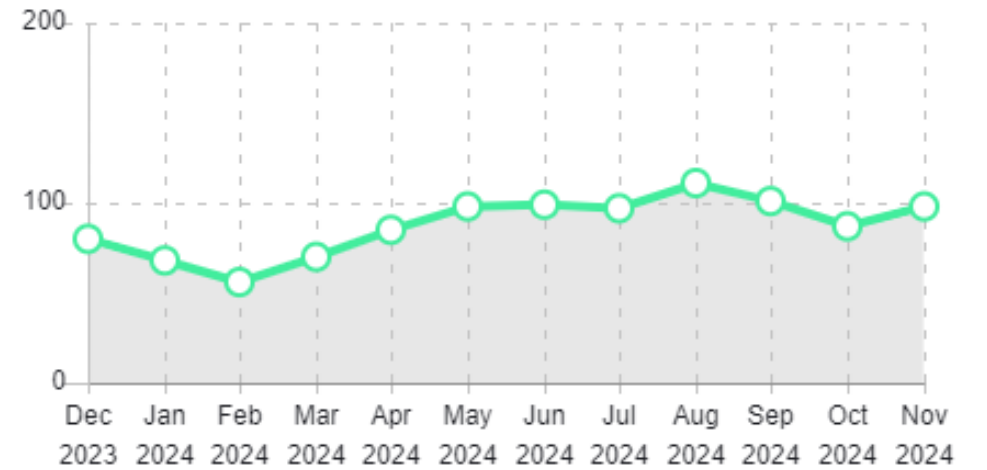

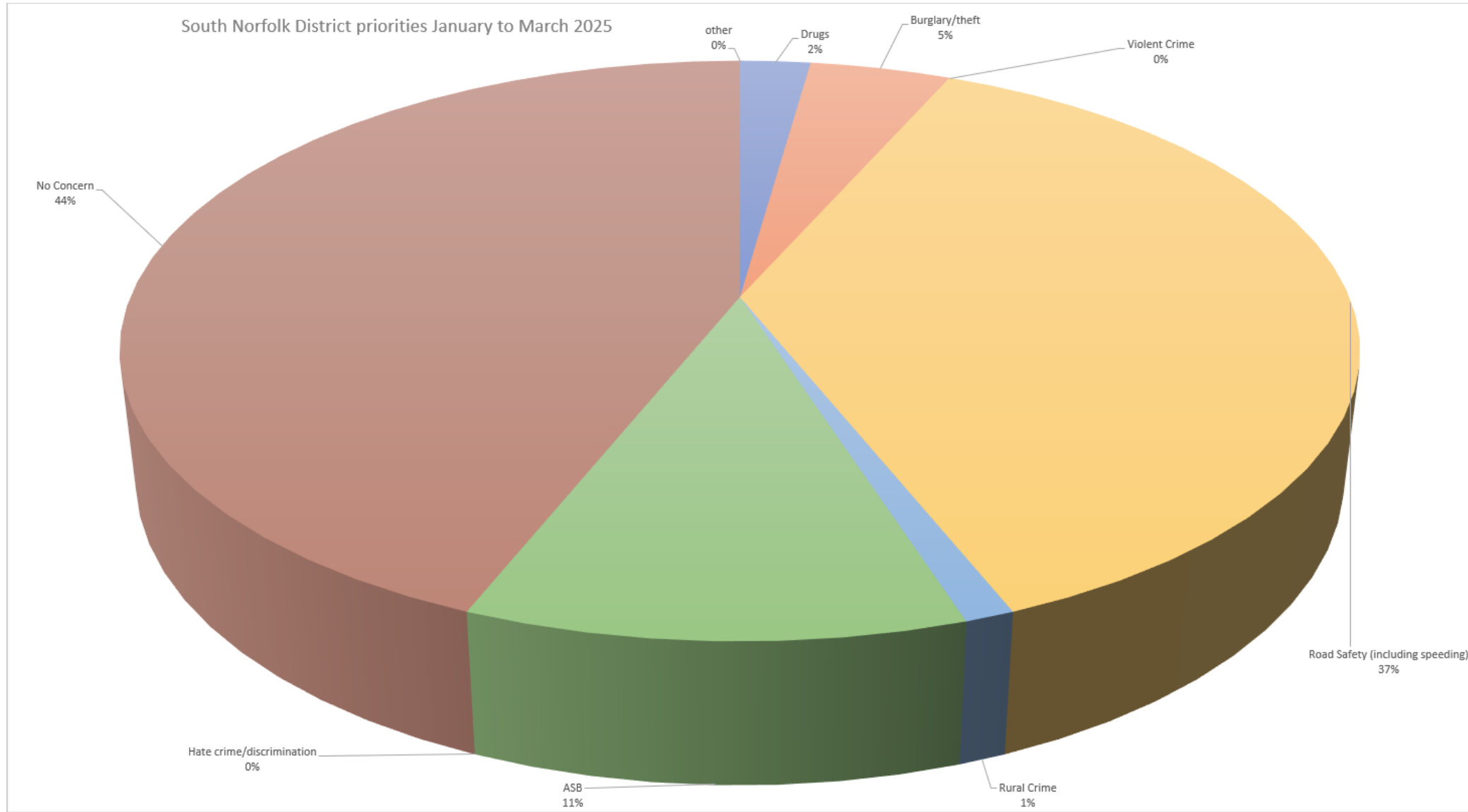

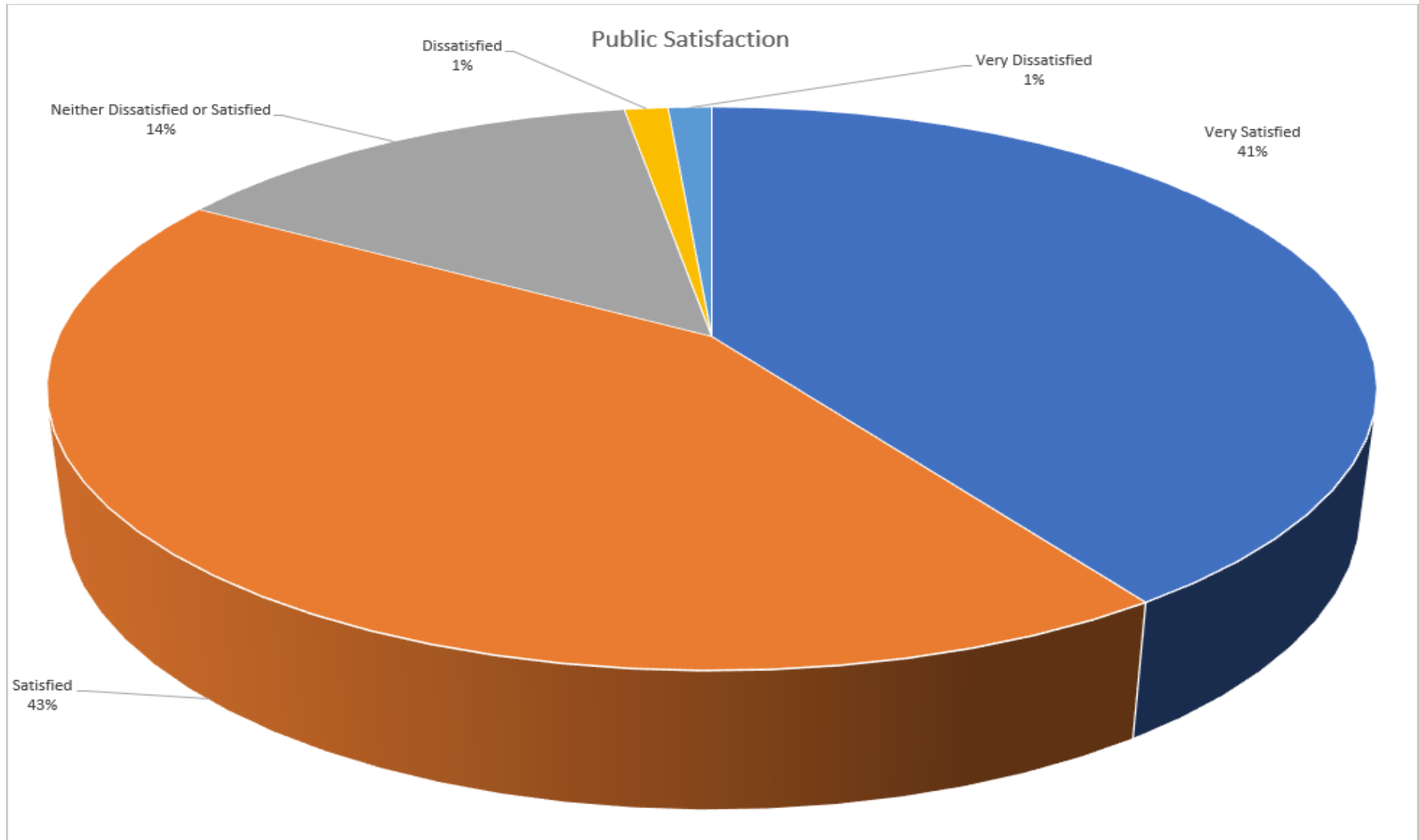
DISTRICT COMMUNITY CONCERNS

- Road safety remains the greatest concern at 37%
- Priorities will be set after this meeting and after consultation with the District Council based on your concerns.
